	of availability but there is no set timeframe or set plan yet.	
	Sheriff Mason: A number of the law enforcement and admin	
	side have received their shots. Due to the weather, the

	forms regarding health insurance coverage.	
	Ads have been posted for Corrections and we currently have 2	Update
	candidates in the process.	
	We are being bombarded by freedom of access requests from the	Update
	media for discipline reports, information about the inmate phone	
	system and other files. I will be sending a memo that gives them	
	info as far as timing for getting information. I will also be	
	sending a press release later today about another issue.	
	Sheriff Mason: Regarding the phone system, Capt. Slaney	
	provided information from our phone provider (Securus) which	
	states that they will be implementing access for family members via tablets at no cost to the facility.	
Treasurer	Richard Davies, Treasurer: Due to the weather today, I've not	Update

	the financials and I'll forward out after the meeting.	
Deeds	Beverly Bustin-Hatheway, Register of Deeds:	Update
Decus	Diane: For the month we are up \$5,788 and YTD \$111, 600.	Opulie
District Attorney	Maeghan Maloney, District Attorney: We did have someone	Update
	in the office test positive for COVID and her last day in office	Cpane
	was Wednesday. We are all working remotely and will follow	
	CDC guidelines for quarantine and be tested before returning.	
	Grand Jury has been cancelled for February and the next will be	
	in March (4 th and 5 th).	
	Nancy: Are we arranging for a deep-cleaning for the office?	
	Bob : I'll get Billy to arrange for a cleaning of all surfaces.	
EMA	Sean Goodwin, EMA Director: The 2 part time planners are	Update
	working remotely all the time. We have a meeting coming up	
	with CDC possibly this Thursday about a mass vaccination site.	
	Art and I are still pushing out a lot of PPE to different facilities	
	throughout the county.	
	Augusta Fire and Delta Ambulance are currently doing vaccines	Update
	for the 1A tier of first responders but beyond that there just aren't	
	enough to go around yet.

	projects are on schedule. Again, thank you to the facilities staff	
	and all of those helping to cover duties.	
	I spoke with Augusta Fuel about the heating system for the large	Update
	conference room and also ordered the air filter parts to go along	
	with that.	
Information Technology	Devon Parsons, IT:	Update
Probate	Kathy Ayers, Register of Probate: Bob: The commissioners	Update
	will be voting on the gift acceptance policy today.	
	Kathy: Legislature bills – the judges gave a presentation on the	
	26 th to the legislature and I also gave a presentation for probate.	
	The same bills are coming back about the blue- ribbon	
	commission and the presumption that everyone going under	
	guardianship needs an attorney along with 11 more substance	
	related bills.	
	There have also been some changes to our confidentiality	Update
	requirements (zoom connection cut out). There is a lot of work	
	in the Supreme Court to make almost all of our records	
	confidential. I will probably be objecting to that as a lot of our	
	records are historical, land grants etc.	
	I would like to say a bit about COVID-19 since we are in the	Update
	same building as the DA's Office. There needs to be a county-	
	wide notice that goes on as far as what the protocol is and this	
	goes along with the survey that we did also as there is no inter-	
	department cooperation.	
	Nancy: Are we going to go ahead and resend all the protocols?	
	Bob: We will get the updated CDC guidelines and share it.	
Sheriff/Corrections:	Sheriff Ken Mason : We've had a lot of movement within the	Update
	correctional facility. I've promoted Corey Goodchild to Asst.	
	Jail Administrator, we've had the oral boards for the new Staff	
	Sergeant position and we have a Sergeant's opening coming up.	
	Capt. Slaney is doing really well with working on some of the	
	things relayed in the employee evaluations.	
	We have 122 inmates and one that has COVID currently and is	Update
	asymptomatic. Any staff that had contact were put out of the	
	facility and tested and they are all back to work now. The inmate

	is in a quarantine block and doing well.	
	Capt. Slaney and myself are working on the budgets.	Update
	Kudos to Dan Brunelle, Mike Gagnon and John Matthews for	
	helping out with issues in the Hill House along with normal	
	duties.	
	In the evidence room which we've been upgrading, a lot of	Update
	changes have been made and some things have been purged that	
	didn't need to be there any longer. There has been a heat pump	
	installed to maintain a constant temperature for evidence.	
	There was a deputy that was injured attempting to make an arrest	
	and he is on light duty working in the detective division.	
	We have one candidate in the process to be hired from Gardiner	
	PD and he will be a buyout if approved. I would like to be able	
	to get the funds to do this and there would be one more to hire	
	following that.	
	We will be calling back one of the detectives currently working	
	in Bangor with DEA to cover staffing.	
	Nancy: Are there any federal funds for the insurrection to cover	
	the Capitol? Sheriff: No, we only received funds for COVID	
	overtime and that was used up.	
Project Updates	There was a pipe that was leaking onto one of the electrical	Update
	boxes in basement and that has been fixed. This building is	
	definitely showing its age and there will be other things that
